

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

- A. Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least three times during each semester.
- There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% Marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- C. There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.



INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

- A. The Procedure for Internal Assessment is prescribed in Annexure III
- Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment of students.
- C. Without CCA/IA, no End semester Examination.

RULES FOR INTERNAL ASSESSMENT IN B.A. PROGRAMMES IN SEMESTER SYSTEM

The marks allotted for Internal Assessment (20%) in each course shall be based on the following:

- Sessional Examination I (Written): 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
- Sessional Examination II (Written): 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
- C. Semester/Group Discussion: 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
- D. Attendance: 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

END SEMESTER EXAMINATION

- A. One end semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester.
- Covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course.
- C. As per Academic Calendar and DU Exam ordinances.
- D. Three Hour duration.

BETTERMENT EXAMINATION

- A Student shall be entitled to take the "betterment examinations" in any two theory Courses of any of the six semesters after passing the sixth Semester examination only once
- 2. In the case the higher narks secured by the student shall be retained.
- The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the sixth semester examination
- No betterment shall be allowed in the practical examinations.

- A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any semester examinations up to Sixth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course (S). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the Carry over course in the next regular examinations of the Courses.
- A student Must clear all his/her Semester Examinations within Six (6) Years from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any programmer irrespective of the Number of examinational appeared by the student.
